Glossary of Terms

kWh - Kilowatt-hours are used to measure the amount of electricity used during a billing period.

kW - Kilowatts are used to measure peak electricity demand during a billing period.

Delivery - These are the costs of delivering electricity from generating stations across the province to ENWIN and then to your home or business. A portion of these charges are retained by ENWIN to build, operate and maintain the local electricity system.

Regulatory - These are the costs of administering the wholesale electricity system and maintaining the reliability of the provincial grid. The majority of these charges are collected by ENWIN and remitted to others.

A portion of these charges are fixed and do not change from month to month. The rest are variable and increase or decrease depending on the amount of electricity that you use.
